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Searching the Internet – A Primer

Searching the Internet is now as common place as driving the car and most people consider the use of just one search engine to obtain results that they are looking for. This paper is designed to open your eyes to the many excellent resources on the Internet to search for information and/or to discover new knowledge! This paper will explain to you a number of ways to search for information on the Internet and methods to continue your searches and knowledge discovery. This paper is also designed for the “newbie” to the Internet or for the person who only uses one source to search for information on the Internet.

There are basically four areas to search for information on the Internet: 1) Search Engines, 2) Indexes and Directories, 3) Intuitive Search and 4) Custom Search and Deep Web Search. This paper will give a brief explanation of each area followed by some examples that you may immediately implement! The goal here is to broaden your search horizons so you may make searching the Internet easier to perform. This paper is not designed for advanced or sophisticated searching techniques as these will be addressed in other of my papers, columns and articles.



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Search Engines

Search engines on the Internet are powered by “bots” that actively go out and search for meta description and keywords in files that are placed on the Internet. When you visit the search engine and type in the keyword or phrase that you are looking for the results that are generated come from the latest searching by the search engine’s bots that are deposited in the search engine’s database. The currency of the results is purely based on when the search engine’s bots visited the site and brought back the meta information to the search engine’s database. There are literally thousands upon thousands of search engines on the Internet and I will list only a few of the larger and better known. I will also list a “list” of search engines all over the world so you can visit many of them to obtain a better understanding of search engines in general!

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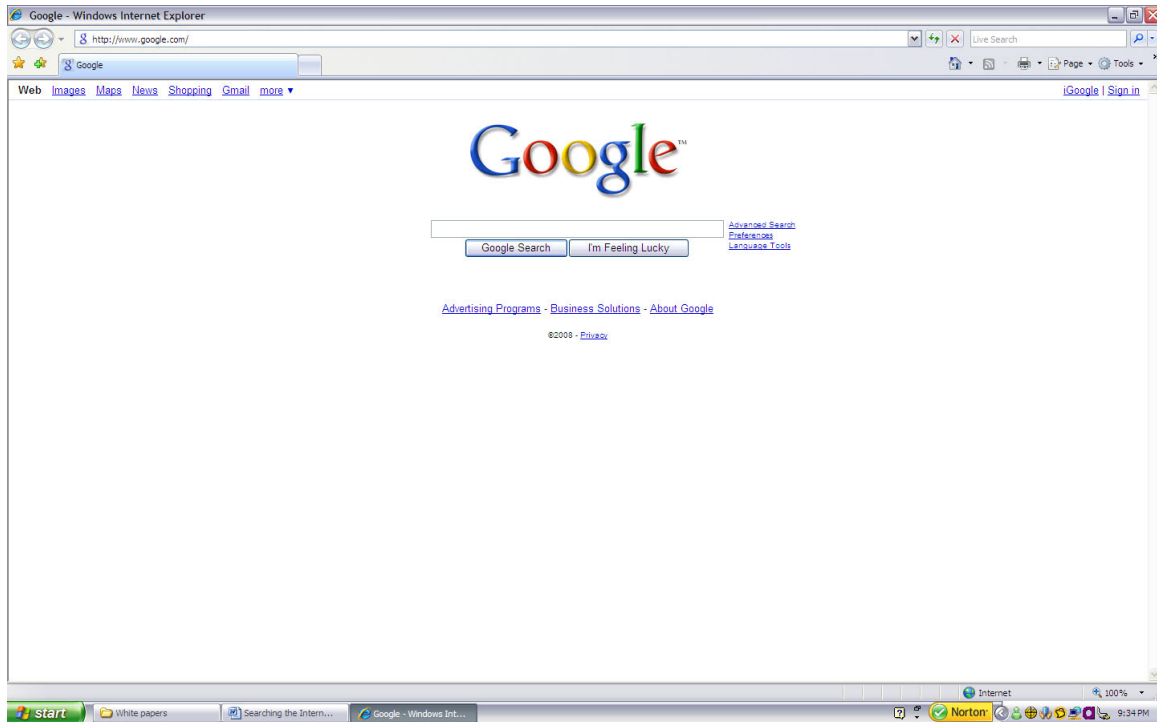


Figure 1: Google™ Search Engine

Indexes and Directories

Most individuals are accustomed to looking for information from directories and indices. This has started with the “telephone” book and then to other similar sources of directory information. The Internet also has a number of directory resources that allow you to search in a more convenient and simple format to find the information that you are looking for by going from menu to menu to menu until you find the subject and/or topic that you are looking for. Many of these are called subject trees, subject directories and are available freely over the Internet. There are literally tens of thousands of directories and subject trees on the Internet and as with Search Engines I will list some of the larger and more popular directories as well as a listing of a Directory of Directories on the Internet.

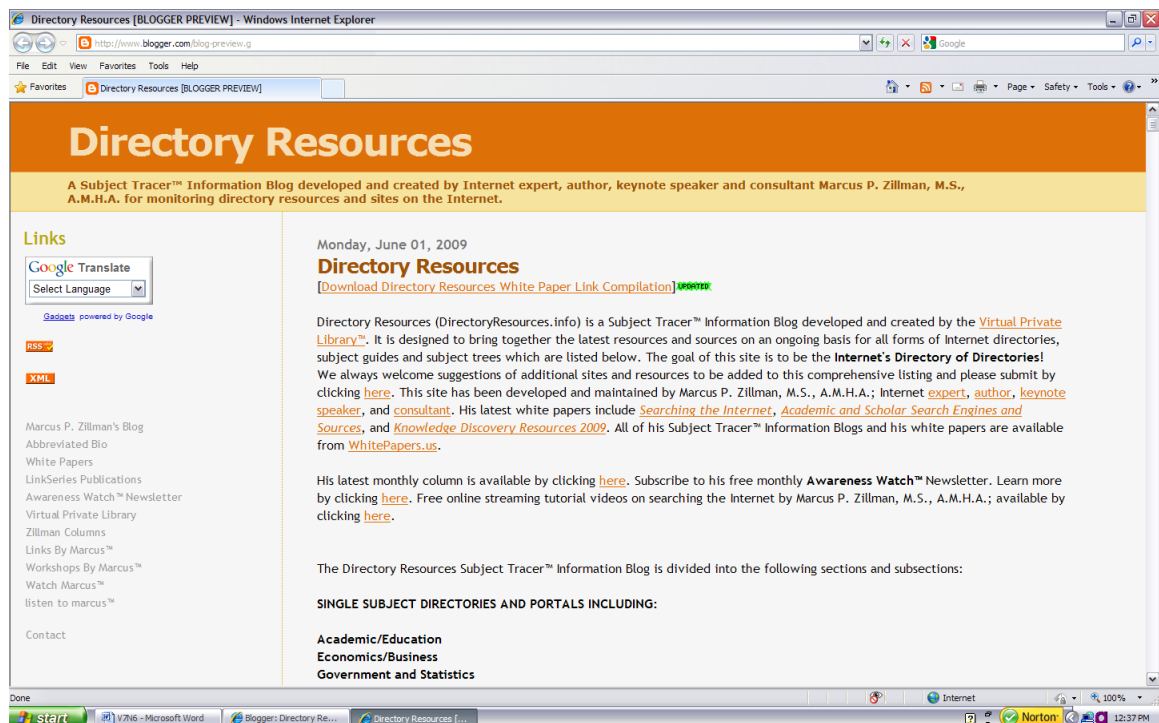


Figure 2: DirectoryResources.info Subject Tracer™



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Intuitive Searching

Intuitive searching on the Internet is a fun way to look for information that could be available. By entering a name ... any name into the search engine it will return potentially relevant results. This is also an excellent way to check out an individual by typing in their complete name and observing the results brought back by the search engine. Sometimes this could be very interesting. As an example with Google™ you may search for results from the Web, results from Images, results from Groups, results from Directories and results from News. All these results are available from the labeled tabs at the top of each of Google's pages. Also you may take the intuitive name and add one of the basic seven domain name suffixes to it to obtain potentially relevant results:

IntuitiveName.biz

IntuitiveName.com

IntuitiveName.info

IntuitiveName.net

IntuitiveName.org

IntuitiveName.us

IntuitiveName.ws

Replace the IntuitiveName with the name that you are searching for i.e. Research or ResearchResources, etc. and add one of the suffixes above and then enter it in the URL line of your browser to see if that site exists today on the Internet. Also remember that if you have more than one word that all the words must run together to become a potential domain name (Research.com, ResearchResources.info, etc.). This could be a very interesting and valuable resource to finding information on the Internet and must be done periodically as new domain names are being created daily! If you do not find anything today it could very well be created tomorrow!!



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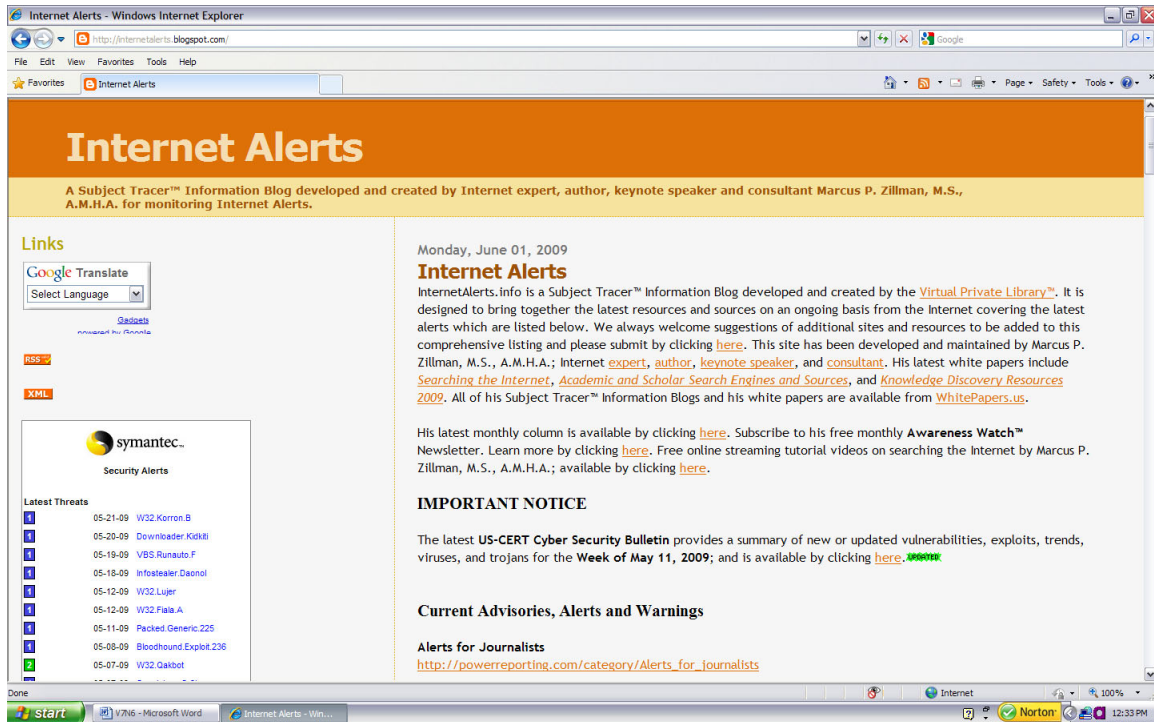


Figure 3: Internet Alerts – InternetAlerts.info Intuitive Name Site

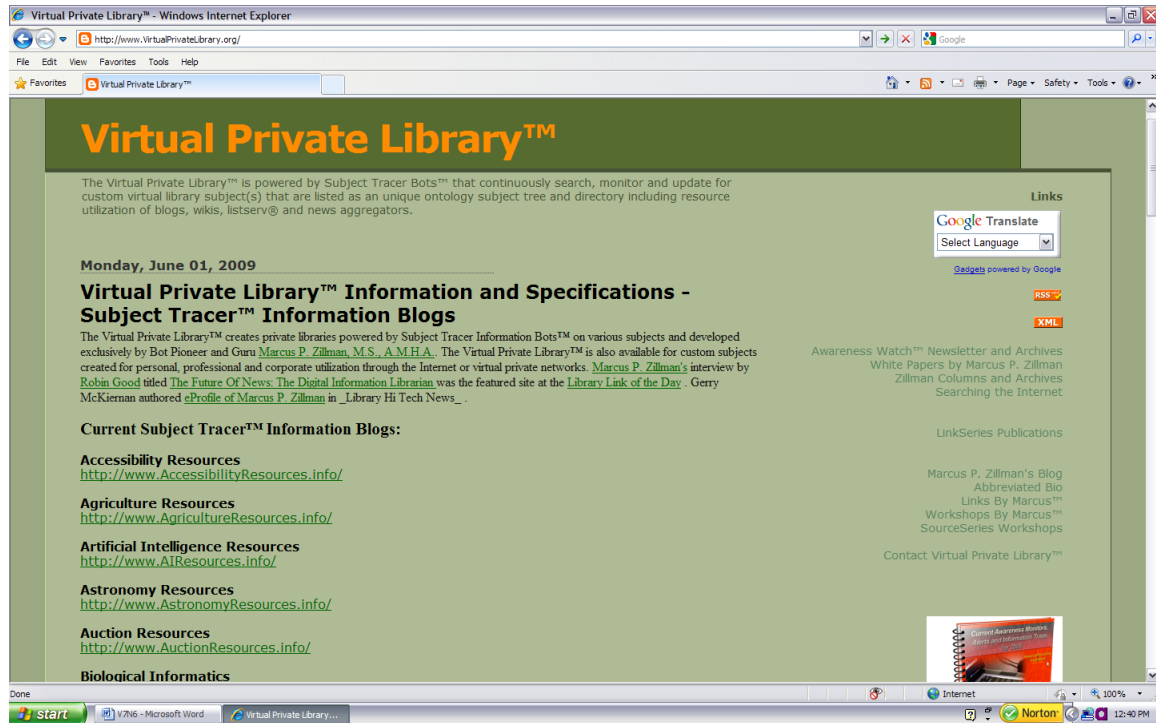


Figure 5: Virtual Private Library™

Melt Mail - Your Temporary eMail Forwarding

Have you ever downloaded a software, where you have to register with your e-mail to receive the activation-code or the download-link? Have you ever registered to a forum with your real e-mail, just to post one question? There are a lot of scenarios as such. And in every case, you give your real e-mail address and get tons of junk-mail as a thankyou. With Melt Mail, you only give your unique Melt Mail address (which forwards to your own), get the desired information and after a defined period of time (the melting point) the Melt Mail address will be deleted. Enter your e-mail address in the text field and choose how long your Melt Mail forward-address should be available -- it's the melting point. After hitting the "create"-button, a unique Meltmail is created which forwards every incoming mail to your e-mail account. After the melting point is reached, they delete your real e-mail address from their forwarding database and also the Meltmail won't be available anymore. So, they only store your e-mail address during the period of time you defined with the melting point. Compared to other services, Melt Mail cares about your privacy! First of all, Melt Mail doesn't store any of the e-mails you forward using this service. The system is simply not interested in them. Secondly, the e-mail address you give to us, is only stored in our mail forwarding database during the period of time you define due choosing a melting point. After that period of time, they only store the normal connection data for the period of time specified by the german law. And the most important part: they don't use your e-mail addresses for sending SPAM or other kind of mails. This has been added to [Privacy Resources](#) Subject Tracer™ Information Blog.

Harris (London: Butterworths, 1984, ninth supplement, 1992) - hereafter referred to as Bowman & Harris - and *International Legal Materials*



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(Washington, D.C., American Society of International Law, 1962-). While it would be desirable to create an index to all types of treaty the magnitude of the task may be illustrated by the fact that the World Treaty Index, compiled by Peter H. Rohn (Santa Barbara, California, 1984), covered all treaties signed between 1900 and 1980, yet comprises over 44,000 entries. Clearly, it is beyond the resources of the present project to bring that work up to date, so the Flare Index to Treaties includes only the most significant treaties, conventions and agreements with at least three parties. 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Reflect: Automated Annotation of Scientific Terms of Proteins and Small Molecules

Reflect is a new service able to recognise proteins and small molecules mentioned in a web page, and link them to information-rich summaries. Simply by pressing a button on your browser, or typing a url in the Reflect's web page, the new service will automatically add hyperlinks to the names of proteins and small molecules. Clicking on an annotated element, displays a pop-up window that gives information about the term, and allows the user to quickly link to more detailed information. For each protein or gene, Reflect provides domain structure, subcellular localization, 3D structure, and interaction partners. For small molecules, Reflect provides the chemical structure and interaction partners. Reflect has three user interfaces: a standard web page, and plug-ins for Firefox and Internet Explorer. The interfaces were constructed using HTML, JavaScript, XMLbased User Interface Language (XUL), and Document Object Model (DOM) events. Communication between browser and server is via XMLHttpRequest objects. HTML documents are sent to the server, which uses regular expressions to distinguish plain text from HTML markup. Substitutions occur only at the free text portion of an HTML page. The text of existing hyperlinks is excluded from the annotation. The text of each document is first parsed for organism names, then parsed again for protein names associated with the organisms found in the first parse, or with a default organism set by the user. Recognized gene, protein, or small molecule names are substituted with hyperlinks that generates a summary popup using overLib (<http://overlib.boughner.us>). The document is returned to the browser with previous HTML tags and their attributes unaffected, hence preserving the original document format. The core component of Reflect is a consolidated dictionary that links names and synonyms to source data entries. It was created by merging the STRING (<http://string.embl.de>) and STITCH (<http://stitch.embl.de>) databases, and it currently contains over 1.5 million proteins from 373 organisms and 4.3 million small molecules. Abstract:

Cloud computing – the creation of large data centers that can be dynamically provisioned, configured, and reconfigured to deliver services in a scalable manner – places enormous capacity and power in the hands of users. As an emerging new technology, however, cloud computing also raises significant questions about resources, economics, the environment, and the law. Many of these questions relate to geographical considerations related to the data centers that underlie the clouds: physical location, available resources, and jurisdiction. While the metaphor of the cloud evokes images of dispersion, cloud computing actually represents centralization of information and computing resources in data centers, raising the specter of the potential for corporate or government control over information if there is insufficient consideration of these geographical issues, especially jurisdiction. This paper explores the interrelationships between the geography of cloud computing, its users, its providers, and governments.

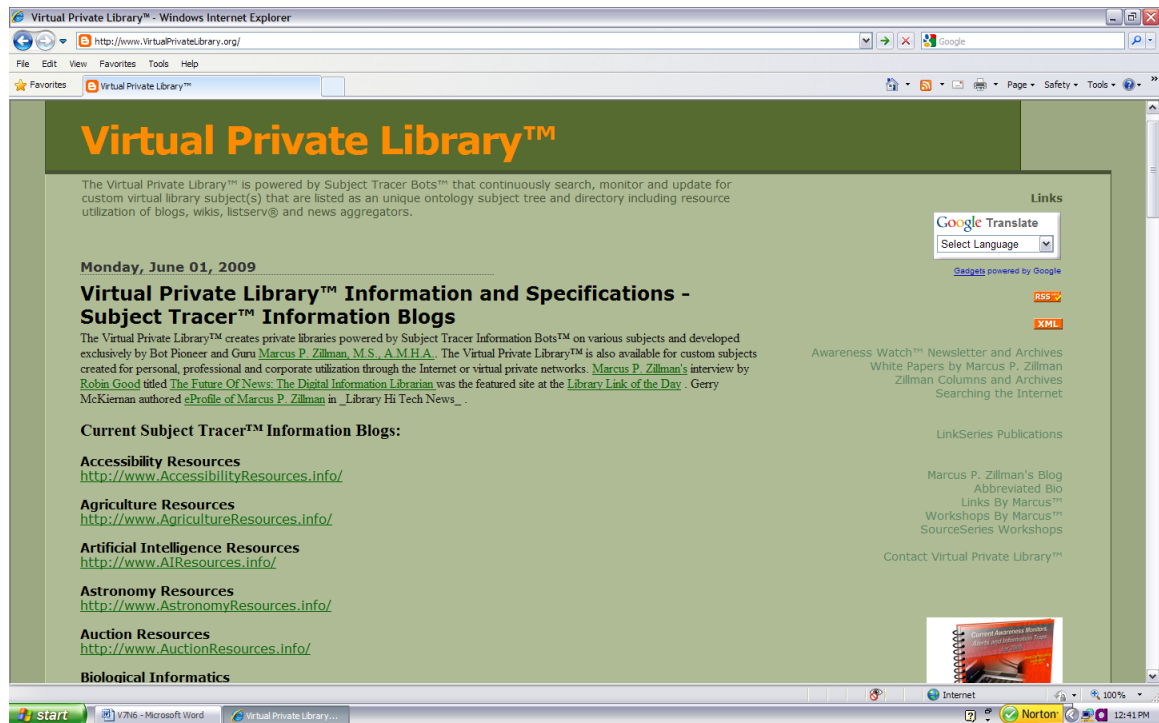


Figure 6: VirtualPrivateLibrary.org
